Vicki Bennett Finance Manager The combined sales for fiscal year 2022 totaled approximately \$7.9 million. While the Co-op had not been

immune to the challenges of COVID-19, inflation, and labor shortages; we were able to maintain our overall sales with a 1.3% increase over the prior 12 months.

The Cost of Goods sold increased approximately 2.9% with operating expenses experiencing a slight increase of .3%.

On 4/1/22 we received a portion of the Employee Retention Credit totaling \$217,000. We anticipate the final payment of \$268,000 to be deposited fiscal year 2023.

The ERC credit allowed us to make much needed capital improvements some of which included: flooring repairs, new digital scales, temperature sensors for cases & coolers for an overall total of \$56,000. The ERC Credit also helped to

In the fiscal year we had 287 new members join the Co-op and 18 members withdraw their membership for a net increase of 269 members. At year end we had a total of 8521 members. The purchase of member shares contributed \$25,183 of equity to the Co-op.

It has been three years since our last inperson Member Annual Celebration, but it seems like it was forever ago. These

past couple of years have definitely been strange. I have now been here at the Co-op for over six years and there have been lots of changes. The biggest change being the way the shopping environment has transformed itself with a greater online presence. The one thing, however, that has stayed consistent throughout has been all of you, our loyal members. Without the over 8500 of you, the Concord Co-op would not be what it is today. For that, I wish you a big thank you!

Total combined sales for the Concord and New London stores were over \$7.9 million and this was an increase over last year's sales of 1.3%. Our membership grew by 287 members putting the total membership over 8500. We were able to take advantage of the Employee Retention Credit that was available through the government COVID-19 relief programs and that money has allowed us to increase wages with the goal of working towards a living wage in the store.

Our partnerships with Canterbury Shaker Village and the UNH School of Law have continued since we last met in person. The organic gardens at Shaker Village are beautiful and have provided lots of fresh produce to the store. The Jury Box Café at UNH was affected by COVID-19 and the school restrictions, but we remained open during the school year last year.

I also want to thank the entire staff here in Concord and New London. They are what makes the stores operate and succeed. They make the Concord Co-op a great place to work and shop.

On behalf of myself and the entire staff here in Concord and New London, we all wish to thank you for your support and dedication to our Co-op. We can not do this without you!
